SYNOPSIS OF UPCOMING FILMS

A CHARLIE BROWN CHRISTMAS (1965-G) 25min. Animation/Comedy/Family, TV movie *“The result is poignant and provides an appealing lesson about the true meaning of Christmas.”* Directed by Bill Melendez, Phil Roman. For Peanuts fans everywhere, it just wouldn't be Christmas without this classic holiday delight. Christmas lights may be twinkling red and green, but Charlie Brown has the Yuletide blues. To get in the holiday spirit, he takes Lucy's advice and directs the Christmas play. And what's a Christmas play without a Christmas tree? But everyone makes fun of the short, spindly evergreen Charlie Brown brings back - until the real meaning of Christmas works its magic once again. *Sponsored by The Purple Platypus. FREE*

A CHRISTMAS STORY (PG-1983) 1 hr. 35 min. Comedy/Family *“It has a warmth and humor that soar with the season.”* Directed by Bob Clark. In the 1940's, in the town of Hammond, 9-year-old Ralphie wants one thing for Christmas -- an official Red Ryder BB rifle. When he asks his mother for the BB gun for Christmas, she says, "No, you'll shoot your eye out". When he writes an essay about it at school his teacher gives him a C+ with a note saying "You'll shoot your eye out." Next he asks Santa for the gun, Santa's response is familiar, he says, "You'll shoot your eye out, kid." Ralph fears that he'll never get the BB gun for Christmas. ELF (PG-2003) 1 hr. 37 min. Comedy/Family/Fantasy *“A disarmingly funny holiday comedy.”* Will Ferrell stars as Buddy, a regular-sized man who was raised as an elf by Santa Claus (Edward Asner). When the news is finally broken to Buddy that he's not a real elf, he decides to head back to his place of birth, New York City, in search of his biological family. Elf also stars James Caan, Mary Steenburgen, Zoey Deschanel, and Bob Newhart. *Sponsored by Bucknell Student Government. FREE*

FROSTY THE SNOWMAN (G-1969) 25 min. Animation/Comedy/Family. *“Retains its charm and all-ages appeal decades after its original broadcast.”* A discarded silk top hat becomes the focus of a struggle between a washed-up stage magician and a group of schoolchildren after it magically brings a snowman to life. Realizing that newly-living Frosty will melt in spring unless he takes refuge in a colder climate, Frosty and a young girl who he befriends stow away on a freight train headed for the north pole. Little do they know that the magician is following them, and he wants his hat back. This animated short is based on the popular Christmas song of the same name. *Sponsored by Threading Love. FREE*

Dr. Seuss' HOW THE GRINCH STOLE CHRISTMAS (G-1966) 26 min. Animation/Family/Comedy, TV Movie *“Its brightness, cleanness, tightness, and wit all go in to making it feel as fresh and alive as any other piece of animation from its generation.”* Chuck Jones' animated version of the classic Dr. Seuss book *How the Grinch Stole Christmas* originally aired on television in 1966 and has since become a holiday family favorite. Voiced by Boris Karloff (who also narrates), the Grinch lives on top of a hill overlooking Whoville with his dog, Max. Each year at Christmas time, the Grinch's hatred grows stronger toward those insufferably cheerful Whos down in Whoville. Content to exchange presents, eat large banquets, and sing songs in the town square, the Whos live in a blissful ignorance of the Grinch's contempt. One year, he gets the idea to stop Christmas from coming by dressing up as Santa Claus. He cobbles together an outfit and makes his dog drag him around on a sleigh while sneaking into the Whos' homes and stealing their presents, food, and decorations. After he has stolen every last thing, the Whos wake up on Christmas morning to sing in the town square, causing the Grinch to question the basis of his nefarious plan. Thurl Ravenscroft (the voice of kid cereal mascot Tony the Tiger) provides the vocals for the song "You're a Mean One, Mr. Grinch." *Sponsored by Threading Love. FREE*

IT'S A WONDERFUL LIFE (1946 – NR) 2hr. 10min. Drama/Family/Fantasy. *“Considered one of the most beloved American films - Frank Capra's masterpiece still has a lot to say about community spirit and is a film with much more to it than feel-good sentimentality.”* Director: Frank Capra. Stars: James Stewart, Donna Reed & Lionel Barrymore. George Bailey grows up in the small town of Bedford Falls, dreaming dreams of adventure and travel, but circumstances conspire to keep him enslaved to his home turf. Frustrated by his life, and haunted by an impending scandal, George prepares to commit suicide on Christmas Eve. A heavenly messenger arrives to show him a vision: what the world would have been like if George had never been born. The film acknowledges the difficulties and disappointments of life, while affirming the values of friendship and individual achievement. *Sponsored by Buffalo Valley Lutheran Village Continuum of Care Retirement Community. JOJO RABBIT (2019-PG-13) 1 hr. 48 min. Comedy/Drama/War. *“Jojo Rabbit” is a smart, accessible, inclusive film that opens doors at a time when many are slamming them shut. It's a celebration of the gift of life that's inviting you to dance with it. So dance with it.”* JoJo Rabbit is about a young boy living during World War II. His only escapism is through his imaginary friend, an ethnically inaccurate version of Adolf Hitler, who pushes the young boy's naive patriotic beliefs. However, this all changes when a young girl challenges those views and causes Jojo to face his own issues.

MOTHERLESS BROOKLYN (2019-R) 2 hr. 24 min. Crime/Drama. *“Norton's stylish and evocative film noir pays homage to the genre with a convincing period re-creation that immerses moviegoers in the gritty urban milieu of 1950s New York.”* Set against the backdrop of 1950s New York, "Motherless Brooklyn" follows Lionel Essrog (Edward Norton), a lonely private detective living with Tourette Syndrome, as he ventures to solve the murder of his mentor and only friend, Frank Minna (Bruce Willis). Armed only with a few clues and the engine of his obsessive mind, Lionel unravels closely-guarded secrets that hold the fate of the whole city in the balance. In a mystery that carries him from gin-soaked jazz clubs in Harlem to the hard-edged slums of Brooklyn and, finally, into the gilded halls of New York's power brokers, Lionel contends with thugs, corruption and the most dangerous man in the city to honor his friend and save the woman who might be his own salvation.

NATIONAL LAMPOON'S CHRISTMAS VACATION (1989-PG-13) 1 hr. 37 min. Comedy. *“John Hughes wrote the screenplay for this silly, warm little guilty pleasure that nails most of the trials and tribulations of spending the holidays with family.”* The Griswold family's plans for a big family Christmas predictably turn into a big disaster.

NT LIVE: Hansard 1 hr. 40 min. The play is set in Britain, on Saturday 28 May 1988, where the Conservative party is in power under Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher. After five days of controversial political debate in parliament about Local Government Act 'Section 28' – which restricted local authorities from promoting homosexuality – Conservative politician Robin Hesketh has returned home to the idyllic Cotswold house he shares with his wife of 30 years, Diana. Robin unwinds from his week in parliament and they prepare for friends arriving for lunch. But we see all is not as blissful as it seems. Diana has a stinking hangover, a fox is destroying the garden, and secrets are being dug up all over the place. As the day draws on, what starts as gentle ribbing and the familiar rhythms of marital scrapping quickly turns to blood-sport.

PARASITE (2019-R) 2 hr. 12 min. Comedy/Drama/Thriller. *“This is a dazzling work, gripping from beginning to end, full of big bangs and small wonders..”* Bong Joon Ho brings his work home to Korea in this pitch-black modern fairytale. Meet the Park Family: the picture of aspirational wealth. And the Kim Family, rich in street smarts but not much else. Be it chance or fate, these two houses are brought together and the Kims sense a golden opportunity. Masterminded by college-aged Ki-woo, the Kim children expediently install themselves as tutor and art therapist, to the Parks. Soon, a symbiotic relationship forms between the two families. The Kims provide "indispensable" luxury services while the Parks obliviously bankroll their entire household. When a parasitic interloper threatens the Kims' newfound comfort, a savage, underhanded battle for dominance breaks out, threatening to destroy the fragile ecosystem between the Kims and the Parks.

RUDOLPH THE RED NOSED REINDEER TV (1964-G) 47 min. Animation, Adventure, Comedy. *“All these years later, as a reminder that every oddball fits in somewhere, it still shines. You could even say it glows.”* This stop-motion animagic version of the classic Christmas tale adds a bit of a twist when Rudolph encounters an abominable snowman. This was made for TV and features Burl Ives as the narrator. *Sponsored by Purple Platypus. FREE*

THE BLACK CANDLE (2008) 1 hr. 11 min. Documentary. A documentary about the struggle and triumph of African-American family, community, and culture, using Kwanzaa as a vehicle to celebrate the African-American experience. The seven principles of Kwanzaa (unity, self-determination, collective work and responsibility, cooperative economics, purpose, creativity and faith) are so important to African-Americans today. The documentary explores the holiday's growth out of the Black Power Movement in the 1960s to its present-day reality as a global, pan-African holiday embraced by over 40 million celebrants.

THE GOOD LIAR (2019-R) 1 hr. 49 min. Drama/Thriller. *“Watching the two old pros work together for the first time was a treat.”* Career con man Roy (Ian McKellen) sets his sights on his latest mark: recently widowed Betty (Helen Mirren), worth millions. And he means to take it all. But as the two draw closer, what should have been another simple swindle takes on the ultimate stakes. Legendary actors Mirren and McKellen star together on screen for the first time in this suspenseful drama about the secrets people keep and the lies they live.

THE LIGHTHOUSE (2019-R) 1 hr. 49 min. Drama/Fantasy/Horror. *“One of the year's best films. Surreal, powerfully acted, and proves that Robert Eggers is one of the premiere arthouse horror directors working today.”* Two lighthouse keepers try to maintain their sanity while living on a remote and mysterious New England island in the 1890's.

THE POLAR EXPRESS (2004 – PG) 1h 40min Animation. *“Utterly enchanting - Its rich characters, spectacular visuals, and unbridled sense of awe and wonder make this the kind of movie families will want to watch together every holiday season.”* Director: Robert Zemeckis; Stars: Tom Hanks, Chris Coppola, Michael Jeter. This is the story of a young hero boy on Christmas Eve who boards on a powerful magical train that's headed to the North Pole and Santa Claus's home. What unfolds is an adventure which follows a doubting boy, who takes an extraordinary train ride to the North Pole; during this ride, he embarks on a journey of self-discovery which shows him that the wonder of life never fades for those who believe. *Sponsored by Evangelical Community Hospital. WHITE CHRISTMAS (1954) 2 hr. Comedy/Musical/Romance. *“A good musical with a lot of star power.”* This Christmas classic starring Bing Crosby is a romantic tale that takes place in a Vermont lodge- where it is almost always, a "White Christmas."
